## DC's Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) Trends and Demographics

The DC Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) helps low-income District residents facing housing emergencies. The program provides funding for overdue rent if a qualified household is facing eviction (including late costs and court fees). The program also supports security deposits and first month's rent for residents moving to new homes.

ERAP serves low-income DC households with children, elderly households (age 60 or older), and people with disabilities. The amount paid on behalf of eligible families depends on a household's income and available resources, and is subject to certain limitations. ERAP payments can only be used once per year for each eligible household.

The average ERAP payment per household for the 3,714 households that received help in 2008 was \$2,023, resulting in total assistance payments of \$7.5 million. The majority of ERAP payments — 78 percent — went to households with children, which included households that also had an elderly member or a member with a disability. Of ERAP payments in 2008, the vast majority (87 percent) went to pay rent in arrears.

There were 1,900 more applicants for ERAP assistance than in 2007 — 5,232 households vs. 4,043 households in 2007. The number of households actually receiving assistance in 2008 — 3,714 — was 25 percent higher than the 3,003 households served in 2007.
